
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REPORT OF STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY 2022-2023

A1. Level of the Student


What degree program are you pursuing now? 170 responses



Majority of the respondents (87.6%) participated in the Student Satisfaction Survey 2022-23 belonged to UG classes.


A2: Stream of Study of the Respondents

A3. Main Department of the Respondents




The students participated in the survey belonged to various departments as shown by the pie diagram above. The composition is well representative of the relative distribution of student strength across the departments.






B. Analysis of Student Satisfaction Survey Data

B1. Coverage of the Syllabus

A half of the respondents have opined that the syllabus completion is more than 85%. Another 23.5% consider the percentage completion of syllabus as in between 70% and 85%. Together, around 75% of respondents are satisfied with the level of syllabus completion in the class room.






B2. Level of Preparation by the Teachers

A very large majority of the respondents (99%) believe that the level of preparation by the teachers is either thorough or satisfactory.


How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 170 responses

About 82% of the students are satisfied with the illustration of concepts by the teachers.


The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications 170 responses



B4. Use of ICT Facilities


Students are not fully satisfied with the use of ICT facilities by the teachers. In their view only a very low proportion of teachings are carried out using LCD projector or smart boards.

B5. Effectiveness of the Communication


Majority of the respondents (91%) are satisfied with the level of communication by the teachers.



B6. Approach toward Teaching


Around 98% of the students are satisfied with the approach of teachers towards teaching.


The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as 170 responses

Majority of the students (95%) are satisfied with the internal evaluation process of the college.






B8. Timely Feedback on Assignments

Around 82% of the respondents are satisfied with the feedbacks given by the teachers on student performances after given assignments.


Was your performance in assignments discussed with you 170 responses

Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities. 170 responses




B10. Mentoring Process

The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.




B11. Identification of Strengths and weaknesses

Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them 170 responses




B13. Level of Information on Graduate Attributes




B14. Facilitation for Student Engagement on Quality Enhancement

The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process



The students have mixed views on the adoption of student centric methods by the teachers. Still, majority (76%) have a favourable response in this regard.


The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences 170 responses

170 responses


