



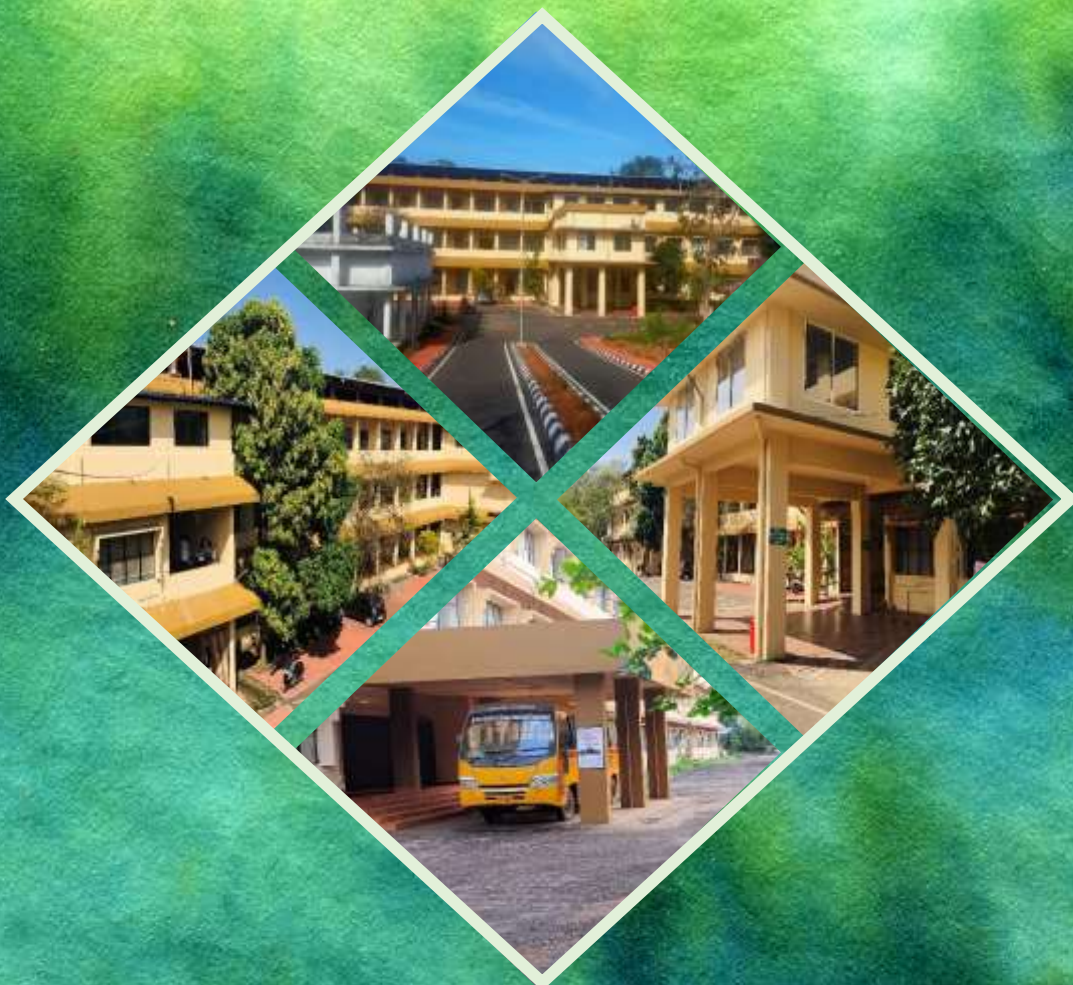

**Introduction**

The department of Hindi organized language sessions for the students of 4<sup>th</sup> standard studying at the Aided Lower Primary School, Varakkad on 20 September 2018. The aim of the programme was to invite children in to the world of Hindi at a very young age. Hindi is our national language and learning of Hindi is essential for national integration. NEP also gives a thrust on learning Hindi.

**Context**

In Kerala, students start learning Hindi only from 5<sup>th</sup> standard. They find it very difficult to add Hindi as a third language after Malayalam and English. Through this extension activity, we aimed to familiarize Hindi to the kids at 4<sup>th</sup> standard itself.

## **CLEANING OF OPEN WELL**

26/01/2019

As part of Republic Day Celebrations, on 26/01/2019, the NSS volunteers of our college cleaned the open well near the ICDS Anganawadi , West Eleri, C.No:45 Elerithattu. The small kids of the Anganawadi and the children of Elerithattu A.L.P School are the major beneficiaries of the drinking water collected from the open well. The silt-accumulation in the well became the cause of concern as availability of water is going down day by day. To collect the silt, the volunteers utilized the support of a village man who climbed down the well. NSS volunteers dumped the collected silt into the waste pit nearby. A total number of 45 volunteers participated in the cleaning up of the open well. They also cleared the bushes



nearby so that anyone could easily access the open well and carry water using the rope and vessel. The focus was not only on ensuring the cleanliness and

health of water sources but also on educating children about the importance of these efforts in disease prevention and environmental conservation.

Smt. Bindu C, the Head Mistress in Charge of the ALP School Elerithattu expressed gratitude towards the volunteers on behalf of the School and Anganavadi. The households nearby the school and Anganwadi were very happy as the well is made very useful for them too.
