



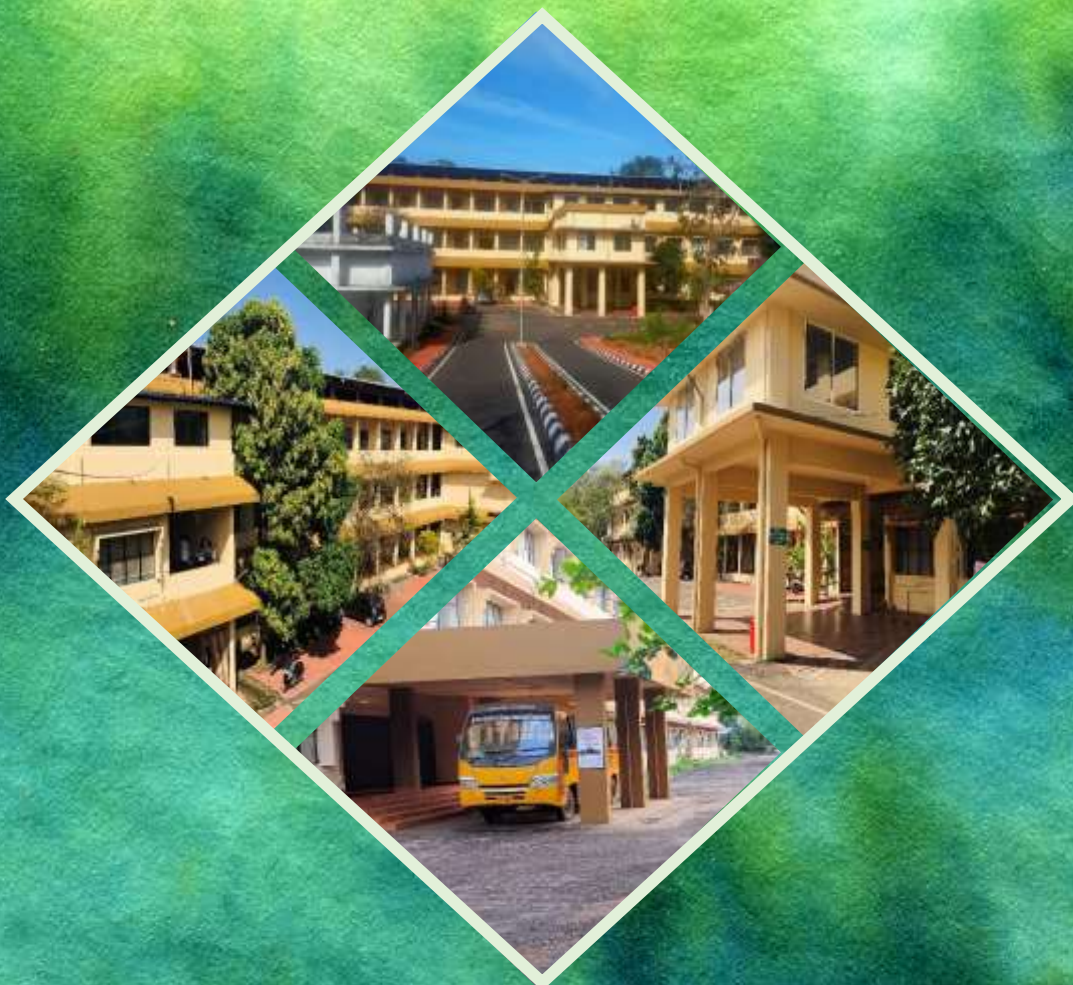

Report of the Workshop on LED BULB ASSEMBLING on 11/09/2019

Introduction

The department of Physics organized a workshop for the Kudumbasree (Women's Self Help Group organized under the Poverty Eradication programme of Kerala Government) members on 22/11/2019. Sri. Dileep Kumar M, Residential Women's Polytechnic, Payyanur was the resource person.

Context

The programme aimed at enhancing the job skills of women members of the Kudumbasree. 10 Kudumbasree members selected on the basis of their technical skill level was identified as the beneficiaries of the programme.

The process

After the inaugural session, a detailed demonstration was made on how to assemble LED bulbs. The resource person made an effective demonstration and after that each of the women participants were given opportunity to work out LED assembling. The resource person corrected each of the wrong practices. By the end of the session, all of the participants were confident enough to do the job their own.

Outcomes expected

- Reduced use of energy
- Economic empowerment of the beneficiaries
- Positive learning externality in the Self Help Groups

Extension Programme Under the Department of Economics

(2019-20)

Title: Water literacy campaign to create awareness of water conservation

Objective and Practice

Water literacy is the ability to feel familiar with water, get actively involved in water and face the issue of water as one's own issue. Being water literate means understanding how the water we use daily is delivered and treated, as well as knowing the quality and safety of that water, how much water we use daily and exactly what we use it for. Recently, the concept of literacy has been expanded to include other genres of literacy such as scientific literacy, media literacy, information literacy and environmental literacy.

The following are the major objectives of the campaign

1. To assess the extent of water consumption among rural household for different purposes
2. To quantify status and trend of bore wells in the survey area and its impact on ground water availability.
3. To make awareness among the rural households about the importance of water conservation

The Context

Acute water scarcity is being faced in the hilly areas in summer period due to drying up of dug wells. Dug wells in midland region get dried up if monsoon is delayed or if there is no summer showers. The increased dependence on bore wells in midland areas leads to drying up of dug wells in lateritic mounds and slopes which affects the water needs of farmers and poor people. The construction of new bore wells by individuals near the existing water supply bore wells badly affecting the yield of many water supply bore wells.

The Practice

. The programme was conducted in two phases. To fulfill first and second objectives, a survey was conducted on **16/12/2019** by the final year B A Economics and M A Applied Economics students of our institution among the households of the ward to which the

College belongs. A structured questionnaire was used to trace regarding water availability consumption pattern of the households. In the second phase , a water literacy class is organized in the college for the households in general focusing on the importance of water conservation and conscious usage of available ground water.

Evidence of Success

- The number of existing bore wells is alarmingly high in the survey and new bore wells were dugged every year leading to uncontrolled exploitation of scarce ground water. Most of the households are unaware about the intensity of the problem and negligible and have awareness about water conservation practices.
- The campaign contributed towards the qualitative enhancement among the households in conserving and use of ground water.
- The different techniques of water conservation discussed in the class was highly benefited to households many of them initiated such methods in their locality.
- The students are actively participated in the entire phase of the programme and thus experienced the practical sides of conducting a survey , organizing a social campaign etc and are also conscious of the importance of water conservation.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Because of the limited time period, we are not able to cover the entire households of the ward. The quantity of ground water consumption was very difficult to estimate because most of the household are using the bore wells for agricultural purposes and there is scarce information regarding the quantity of usage.

CONSTRUCTION OF WASTE PIT AT ELERI

02/10/2019

On 2nd October 2019, the NSS volunteers of our college constructed a waste disposal facility with three compartments made of laterite stones. 23 NSS volunteers took part in the construction process and the skill demanding work was a learning experience for many. Each compartment was earmarked for different types of waste materials- one for plastic wastes, the other for paper wastes and the last compartment for food wastes. This facility has been utilized by the ICDS Anganwadi, A.L.P School Elerithattu and our college inmates too. As the facility is comparatively big large amount of waste materials could be collected. The food wastes have been taken to the nearby pig farms. The plastic wastes are collected by the West Eleri Grama Panchayat and the paper wastes are collected by the scrap dealers at regular intervals.

As part of the 7-Day residential camp during the Christmas vacation, on 23rd December 2019, the NSS volunteers of our college conducted a special medical camp for differently abled persons. Patients who require palliative care including kidney failure, multiple sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, rheumatoid arthritis, neurological disease, dementia, congenital anomalies were given special medical attention and diagnosis in the camp. A total of 61 differently abled persons attended the special medical camp. 49 NSS volunteers supported the medical team led by the doctors of Narkilakkad P.H.C. Efforts were made to capacitate and facilitate the differently abled persons and their care givers for accessing medicines and other rehabilitation services

CONSTRUCTION OF CHECK DAM AT MARNNADAM STREAM

26/12/2019

On 26th December 2019, the NSS volunteers of our college constructed a check dam which can store excess water at Marnnadam stream near Varakkad, in West Eleri Panchayat in order to counteract erosion by reducing water flow velocity. The households and villagers nearby are benefited because of the check dam as water from the dam could be used for the irrigation of crops planted on the banks of the stream. Also, it could reduce siltation and sedimentation from catchment areas into nearby Mangode river. The small check dam has been built with loose stones available in the stream itself. A total number of 39 NSS



volunteers actively participated in the small dam construction. Programme Officer, Soji. M. Sebastian led the volunteer team in the Dam construction. West Eleri ward members, nearby villagers and police officials from Chittarikkal Police Station gave support to the volunteers morally, physically and financially.
