

WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY CELEBRATION

05/06/2018

On 05/06/2018, the NSS volunteers celebrated World Environment Day by cleaning the CHAITHRAVAHINI RIVER banks near Elerithattu. Around 1.5 k.m of the both sides of the river was cleaned. Too many plastic wastes and glass bottles were collected from the river bank. The volunteers were determined to promote environmental protection and uphold environmental values. Teachers and non-teaching staff of the college actively participated in the cleanliness drive along with NSS volunteers. The collected garbage, waste materials and plastic remnants were deposited in the facilities provided by the West Eleri Grama Panchayat. After the cleanliness drive the volunteers returned to college premises and planted tree saplings. 35 student volunteers, 6 teachers and 5 non- teaching staff were there in the committed effort.



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CLEANING OF OPEN WELL

26/01/2019

As part of Republic Day Celebrations, on 26/01/2019, the NSS volunteers of our college cleaned the open well near the ICDS Anganawadi, West Eleri, C.No:45 Elerithattu. The small kids of the Anganawadi and the children of Elerithattu A.L.P School are the major beneficiaries of the drinking water collected from the open well. The silt-accumulation in the well became the cause of concern as availability of water is going down day by day. To collect the silt, the volunteers utilized the support of a village man who climbed down the well. NSS volunteers dumped the collected silt into the waste pit nearby. A total number of 45 volunteers participated in the cleaning up of the open well. They also cleared the bushes

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CONSTRUCTION OF WASTE PIT AT ELERI

02/10/2019

On 2nd October 2019, the NSS volunteers of our college constructed a waste disposal facility with three compartments made of laterite stones. 23 NSS volunteers took part in the construction process and the skill demanding work was a learning experience for many. Each compartment was earmarked for different types of waste materials- one for plastic wastes, the other for paper wastes and the last compartment for food wastes. This facility has been utilized by the ICDS Anganwadi, A.L.P. School Elerithattu and our college inmates too. As the facility is comparatively big large amount of waste materials could be collected. The food wastes have been taken to the nearby pig farms. The plastic wastes are collected by the West Eleri Grama Panchayat and the paper wastes are collected by the scrap dealers at regular intervals.



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CONSTRUCTION OF CHECK DAM AT MARNNADAM STREAM

26/12/2019

On 26th December 2019, the NSS volunteers of our college constructed a check dam which can store excess water at Marnnadam stream near Varakkad, in West Eleri Panchayat in order to counteract erosion by reducing water flow velocity. The households and villagers nearby are benefited because of the check dam as water from the dam could be used for the irrigation of crops planted on the banks of the stream. Also, it could reduce siltation and sedimentation from catchment areas into nearby Mangode river. The small check dam has been built with loose stones available in the stream itself. A total number of 39 NSS



volunteers actively participated in the small dam construction. Programme Officer, Soji. M. Sebastian led the volunteer team in the Dam construction. West Eleri ward members, nearby villagers and police officials from Chittarikkal Police Station gave support to the volunteers morally, physically and financially.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION
